No similar provision.	<p>By December 31, 2024, requires GAO to submit an initial report to Congress that:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Identifies and describes health care transparency tools and Federal health care reporting requirements.</li> <li>Reviews how such tools are enforced.</li> <li>Analyzes if public availability of health care transparency tools and the publication of data has been utilized/valued by consumers (with reasons) and assisted plan sponsors/fiduciaries improve benefits, lower costs for enrollees, and meet fiduciary requirements.</li> <li>Makes several recommendations to Congress concerning such tools to improve them, streamline requirements, address gaps, ensure consistency.</li> </ol> <p>By December 31, 2028, requires GAO to submit a final report to Congress that:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Makes updates to information from the initial report.</li> <li>Any new information with respect to health care transparency tools that have been released or new reporting requirements in effect.</li> </ol>	No similar provision.	<p>Within 2 years of enactment, requires GAO to submit a single report to Congress on transparency of prescription drug costs and prices, including:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Both Federal and State statutory and regulatory reporting requirements for health plans and PBM related to prescription drug costs and prices.</li> <li>The extent to which Federal and State statutory and regulatory reporting requirements overlap or are in conflict.</li> <li>Resources needed by health plans and PBMs to meet the reporting requirements.</li> <li>Other items determined appropriate by the GAO.</li> <li>Recommendations for legislation and administrative actions that would streamline and reduce burden associated with reporting requirements for health plans and PBMs.</li> </ol>	No similar provision.
